


WHAT IS A MEDICAL HOME?

It is an approach to providing comprehensive primary care.

A Medical Home is not a house, office or hospital.

A Medical Home is the primary care clinician and his/her team, where they work as a team with the family/patient to make sure the medical and non-medical needs of the child/youth are met.



Improve access to care coordination within a medical home for families of children and youth with special health care needs.


Increase the percentage of primary pediatric practices reporting use of care plans for children and youth with special health care needs patients that have been developed and shared with families.




DELAWARE'S COMMUNITY VOICE
