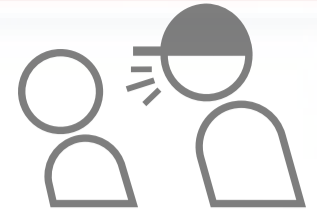

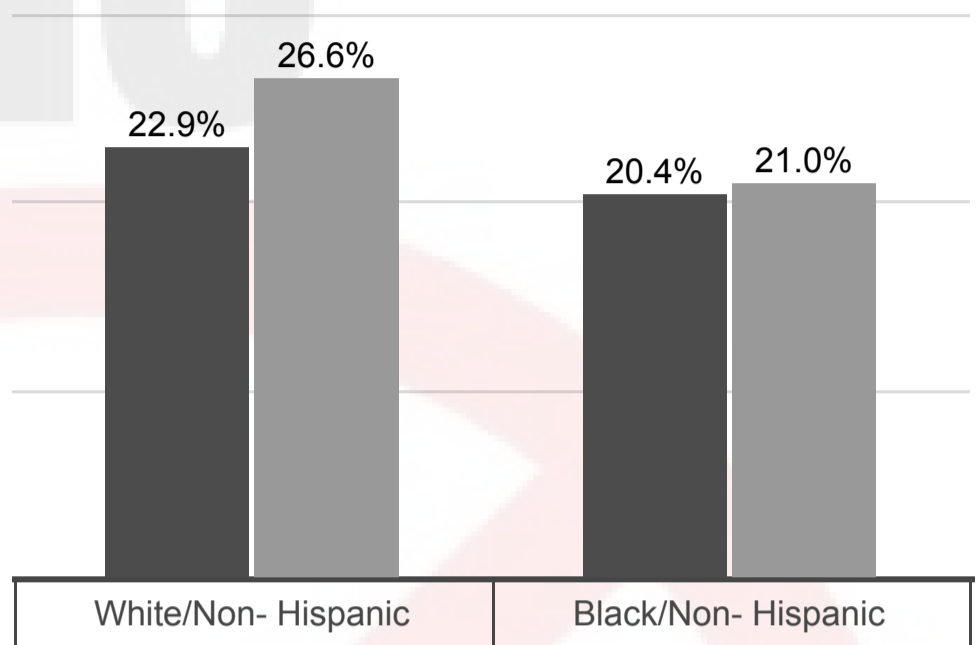


★ ADOLESCENT WHO ARE BULLIED OR WHO BULLY OTHERS

Emotional and behavioral problems experienced by victims, bullies, and bully-victims may continue into adulthood and produce long-term negative outcomes.

▲ HOW ARE WE DOING?

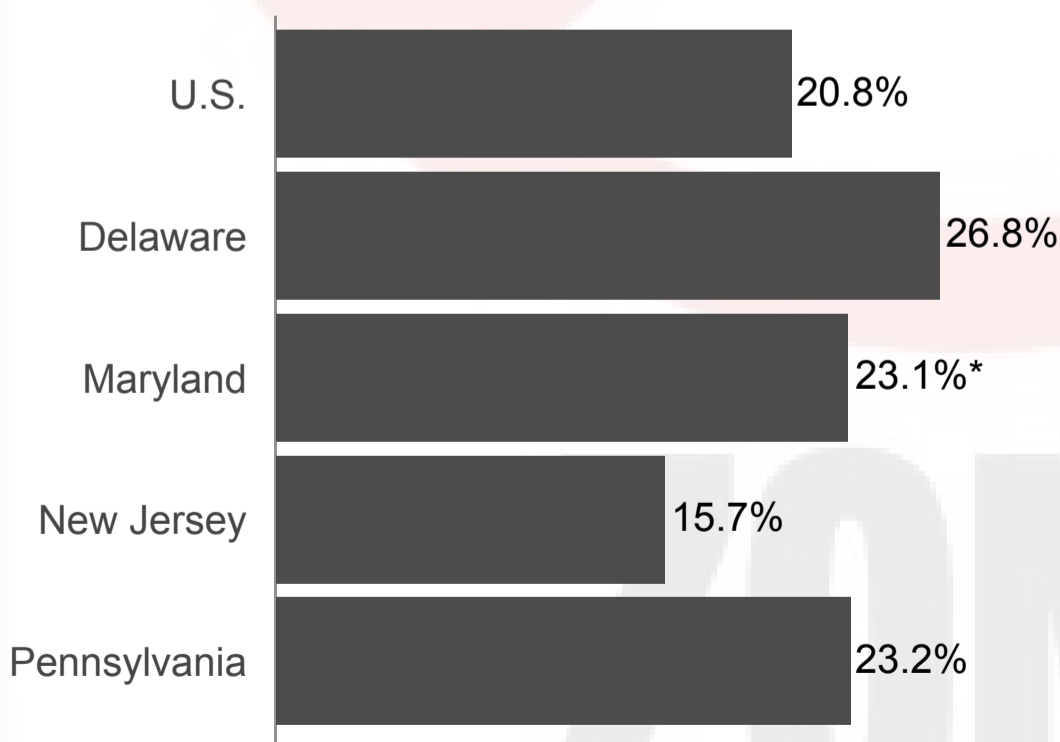
According to the 2017 National Survey of Children's Health, Delaware adolescents, ages 12-17, are bullied at a higher rate than the national rate.

- * Decrease the number of children who report being bullied on school property at the high school level.
- * Decrease the percentage of high school students reporting feeling hopeless for two or more weeks at a time in the past 12 months.

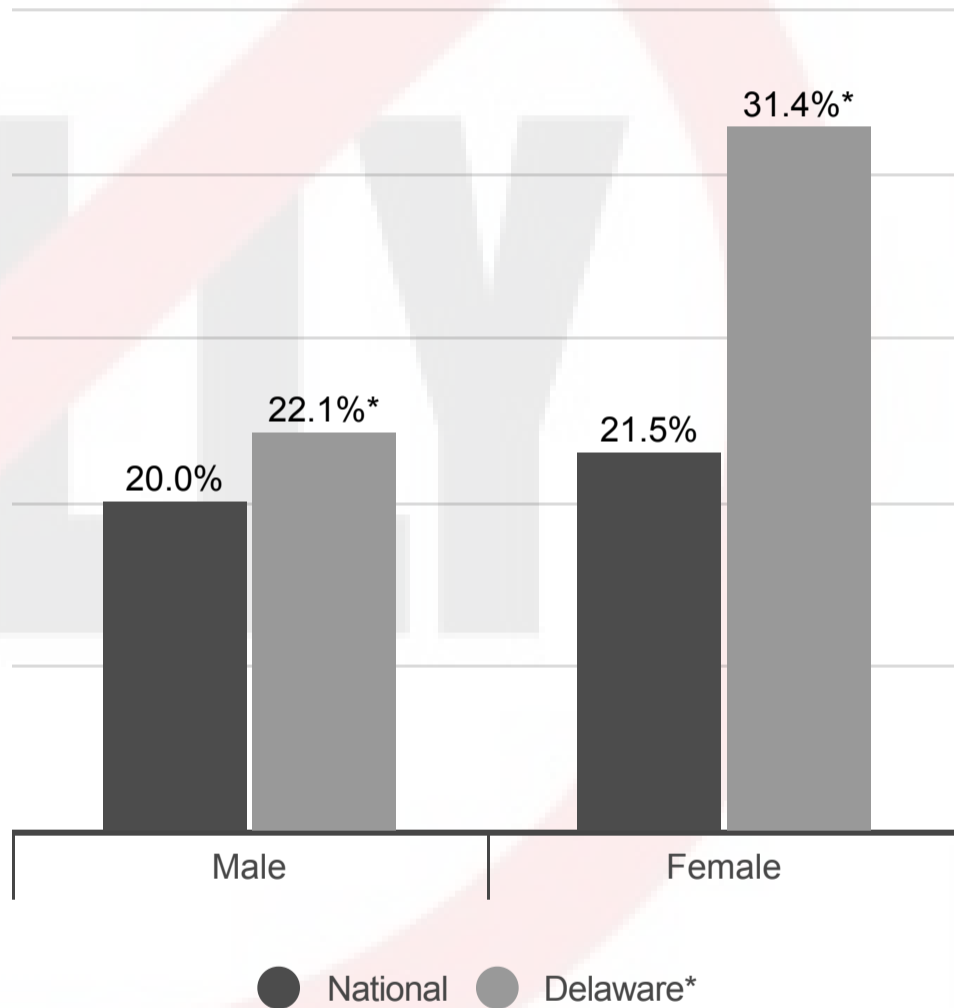
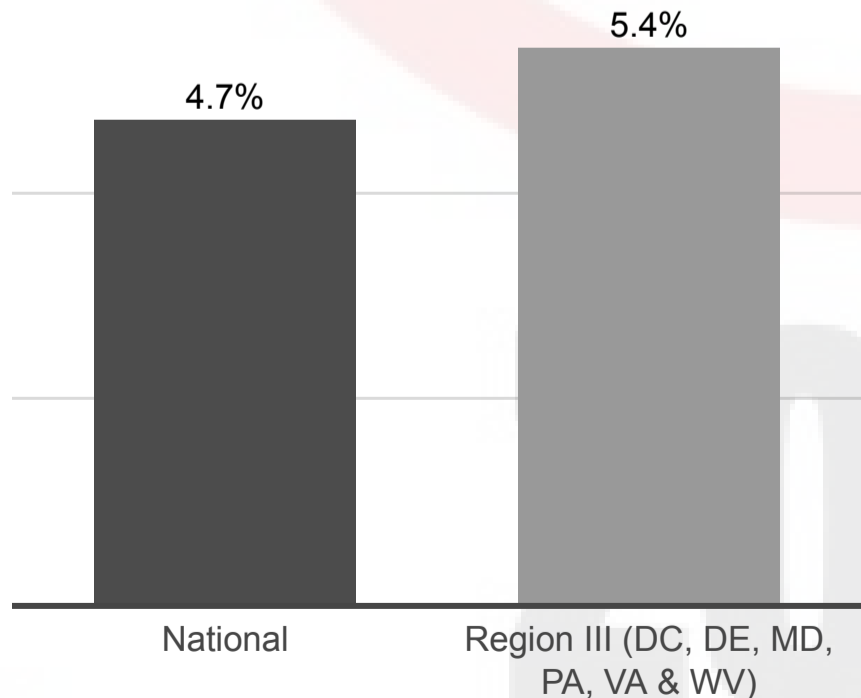


DELAWARE'S COMMUNITY VOICE
