This workgroup would research national and in-state best practices, review the current practice environment across School Based Wellness Centers in Delaware. Currently there is great variance across publicly funded SBWCs and those that are supported by hospitals or other private healthcare systems. A clear expectation for DHSS/DPH is to come up with a minimum standard of clinical offerings upon which expanding SBWCs can build their menu. The workgroup will also explore wraparound support, education and prevention services provided at school based health centers. SBWCs can only be successful if the workgroup were to explore approaches to deliver both best practices and promising approaches in behavior change through education and prevention as well as clinical support.

With these expectations in mind the workgroup will make recommendations on the following:

- A recommended list of national and in-state best practices and promising practices that also support multi-sectoral collaborative practices to examine for potential implementation across the State of Delaware
- Recommendations for spread and scale within DE of these manualized models
- Any policy, practice, infrastructure changes that may be needed to ensure adoption with fidelity
- Actionable Strategies across promotion, prevention, intervention and treatment across public and private agencies, and develop mechanisms for tracking implementation and outcomes from the implementation of these best practices
- Identify any technical assistance and support needs to implement these practices with fidelity

A critical aspect of implementing these best practices and programs with fidelity and ensuring sustainable funding is to have robust data collection and reporting protocols that lead to strong and credible data driven decision making practices. Due to various decisions in the past on data collection and reporting, this infrastructure is currently weak and needs to be rebuilt. This workgroup will also examine and make recommendations that address the rebuilding of a stronger data infrastructure:

- Examining current data reporting infrastructure and practices including spreadsheets, databases and EMRs
- Examining current available data reports
- Recommend approaches to redesign an integrated data collecting and dashboarding blueprint
- Identify technical capabilities needed to support the identified data collection and dashboarding template
- Identify workforce capabilities needed to support said data collection and dashboarding template
- Develop actionable strategies and a recommended workplan to implement the blueprint
- Develop an approach to track progress

The workgroup will develop these actionable set of recommendations for the Steering committee for consideration by November 20, 2020. It is expected that the workgroups will need to consult with each other and with the Steering Committee and these exchanges will be facilitated by the Executive Sponsors to the workgroup from the Steering Committee.
